The Native Friendship Centre unveils its large-scale, unifying project

Val-d'Or, May 1, 2023 The Val-d'Or Native Friendship Centre is proud to announce a major infrastructure renovation and expansion project in downtown Val-d'Or.

The announcement was made in the presence of the Minister of Crown-Aboriginal Relations, the Honourable Marc Miller and the Minister responsible for First Nations and Inuit Relations, Ian Lafrenière. This project represents an investment of \$60 million, of which \$40 million comes from the Government of Canada, more specifically from Infrastructure Canada (\$25 million), and from Indigenous Services Canada (\$15 million). As announced in the last provincial budget, Quebec will contribute \$10 million. The Native Friendship Centre has also received support from the Fondation Lucie et André Chagnon, which is contributing \$10 million.

The Centre was assisted by the City of Val-d'Or, which, in addition to supporting the project, helped facilitate the team's work throughout the process.

With a view to consolidating its social and community vocation and increasing its social economy activities, this project will generate significant spin-offs in its milieu, whether through an enriched offer of culturally relevant and safe services for the community members, access to community spaces and living environments, job creation and the participation of Indigenous people in the economy, all of which will promote the improvement of the quality of life of First Peoples in Val-d'Or.

A forward-looking project

The project involves the construction of a new five-storey pavilion, adjacent to the Centre's current building and dedicated in part to accommodation services. This pavilion will be built on the Centre's land, on the existing parking space. The building will be entirely carbon neutral and will be highly energy efficient and resilient to climate change. The current building will be completely renovated in order to ensure the sustainability of its infrastructures, to redevelop the spaces freed up by the expansion, to increase its capacity to deploy an enriched offer of services to the community and to develop living environments promoting Indigenous users' well-being.

The new pavilion will also include the reception, kitchen, dining room, community living areas, office space, a multi-purpose room and the Indigenous Health Clinic. In total, the new extension will cover an area of 4194 m².















A culturally safe partnership

For nearly 50 years, the Centre has been one of the providers of accommodation services for patients of the Cree Board of Health and Social Services of James Bay (CBHSSJB) who come to Val-d'Or to receive health care. The two organizations are pleased to announce their continued partnership. The three upper floors of the new pavilion will include 48 rooms with private bathrooms, for a total of 90 beds, as well as communal areas specifically for Cree patients to socialise and prepare meals together. Thus, the Centre will become a key player in the accommodation of CBHSSJB patients and their close caregivers who accompany them to Val-d'Or.

A venue for artists and knowledge-carriers

In addition to being a unifying project, it is an exceptional opportunity to affirm the identity and pride of the Anicinabe First Nation as well as other First Peoples who live in, frequent and transit through Val-d'Or. It will provide a space for the dissemination of culture, identity, language and territorial issues. It will allow Indigenous artists to spread and share the knowledge and traditions of Indigenous peoples, especially the Anicinabek.

The Val-d'Or Native Friendship Centre is a privileged gathering place and a public forum advocating for the well-being, rights and individual and collective interests of Indigenous people coping with the urban reality.

The current service corridor between the Cree Board of Health and Social Services of James Bay and the CISSS de l'Abitibi-Témiscamingue facilitates access to care for nearly 9,000 Cree patients and their caregivers each year. More than 80% of them are accommodated in hotels in Val d'Or and the surrounding area due to a lack of accommodation resources. With an average length of stay of four nights for our clienteles, some of whom with a fragile health, our partnership with the Native Friendship Centre will be an added value to our service offer. It also represents a mutual trust between our two organizations.
